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What will happen after my test?

During the flexible cystoscopy, we may take some biopsies, these will be sent to the laboratory to be analysed by a pathologist. The results will either be sent to your GP, or you will have an appointment in the outpatients department, to discuss the results with a member of the urology team.

As you have been advised, the flexible cystoscopy procedure that has been completed carries a small risk of infection.

To prevent this:

- Following the flexible cystoscopy it is very important that you drink well for at least two
 days. This is to make sure that the urinary system is well flushed and discourages an
 infection.
- Watch out for signs of an infection for the next few days, for example a fever or pain when passing urine.

Light bleeding after this procedure is not uncommon, however this should settle within 24 hours. If the bleeding becomes heavier or you notice clots, please contact your GP or attend your nearest walk in centre for advice.

If you are not able to pass urine at all, call your doctor. If you are unable to see a doctor immediately, you may be advised to attend an emergency department.
