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Why is it done?

If we want to know about some hormones, particularly the ones that control growth, puberty and development then a single blood test may not be accurate. It is more useful to take several samples of blood, after giving a substance that should make the hormone level rise.

The test measures the amount of hormones produced that start puberty. It is used to look at whether the pituitary gland is working and investigate pubertal disorders, such as early or late puberty.

This investigation is only done in hospital, when really needed and under close observation.

Where is it done?

Please report to the children's ward at 8am on the morning of your child's appointment.

Does my child need any preparation?

Usually your child will need to have been eating normally up to the day of the test. Your child does not need to fast. Local anaesthetic cream may be put on your child's arm, so the blood test should not hurt.

What happens?

A small plastic tube is put into your child's arm using a fine needle. The needle is then removed. The plastic tube stays in their arm until all the blood tests are complete, several blood samples will be taken over a period of 2 - 3 hours.

Sometimes more than one hormone is tested at a time, in which case the test may take a little longer.

Depending on the hormones to be studied, your child may be given something by mouth or through the tube, to make the hormone level rise. Your child will have their pulse and blood pressure recorded during the tests. Once the blood samples are completed, the plastic tube is removed and your child can go home after having something to eat.

What should I do if I have any problems?

If you have any worries or concerns, please ring the ward at any time.

Help us to help you, by attending you child's follow-up appointments at the hospital clinics on the date and time shown on your appointment card/letter. If, for any reason, you are unable to attend please let us know.
