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Post-operative Instructions following jaw cyst surgery

Pain

- You should not have pain immediately after your surgical procedure due to the local anaesthetic used. This should last for 3 - 4 hours before sensation returns slowly. Care should be taken to avoid biting the lip or tongue during this time.
- Simple painkillers e.g. Paracetamol, should be adequate to control any pain.
- If there is a sudden increase in pain after a few days please contact the department for advice.

Swelling

- This is common after surgery has been carried out.
 Swelling reaches its maximum approx. 48 hours following surgery.
- You may also experience some jaw stiffness which is to be expected.
- Bruising of the face may occasionally occur and can take up to 2 weeks to resolve.

Bleeding

 If any, this should be minimal by the time you leave the department. If persistent bleeding occurs, roll up a piece of clean gauze, place it over the wound and press firmly for at least 15 minutes.

Infection

If your wound becomes hot, swollen and very painful or oozes pus, it may be infected and you may require antibiotics, please telephone the department for advice.

Oral Hygiene

- The surgical wound may be packed with an antiseptic material to help reduce the size of the cyst. This will be sutured (stitched) into position in your gum/cheek. This may feel strange but try to avoid touching it with your tongue or fingers.
- Use a warm salt-water mouth wash after 24 hours. This helps promote healing.
- You may be given an antiseptic mouthwash to use, follow the instructions given to you by the surgeon.
- Keep your teeth clean with a soft tooth brush.

Diet

- Your mouth opening may be restricted for about a week.
- Eat a balanced soft diet.
- Use your own discretion and gradually start eating normally according to your own pace.

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Stitches

 If you have stitches (sutures) in your mouth you will be advised if they are dissolvable or need to be removed.

Medication

 Antibiotics are not required routinely, if prescribed, advice will be given in the department.

Follow-up

 If a follow-up appointment is needed you will receive an appointment through the post for review, pack change and the results of your pathology test will be discussed with you.

Exercise/Smoking/Alcohol

Is not advised following a surgical procedure.

Emergency contact

If you need any further advice, have any problems or feel unwell after your procedure including:-

- Difficulty breathing or swallowing.
- Fever or high temperature.
- Excessive bleeding.
- Severe pain not relieved with pain killers.
