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When you arrive on the ward

You will be asked to arrive at hospital for 7.30am and you will be given an allocated bed space on the ward. Usually there are 3 dental patients, sometimes 4.

You should expect to be at hospital until late morning, maybe lunchtime. A nurse will come with a Health Play Specialist to introduce themselves, and complete pre-operative paperwork.

The nurse will provide an identity bracelet for each wrist and a blue 'nil by mouth' bracelet. They will also check your weight. All female patients over the age of 12 years will be required to provide a urine sample for routine pregnancy testing.

The dentist and the anaesthetist will come to see you whilst you are on the ward. It may be decided that you need a pre-medication. This is a small amount of medication that helps you to relax ready for your anaesthetic. This will be prepared by your nurse, and Theatre will send a trolley down for you to lie on whilst you take it. This is because it will make you feel very relaxed and you may even fall asleep.

When it is time to go to the theatre

If you **haven't** had pre-medication, you will walk up with the Health Play Specialist and your parent/guardian.

If you **have** had pre-medication, a member of the Theatre team will come and collect you, along with a member of the Nursing Team, your parent/guardian and the Health Play Specialist.

You will arrive at Theatre Reception and a member of the team will ask some of the same questions and 'check you in'. One parent and the Health Play Specialist will put some 'fancy dress' on as they will be coming into Theatre with you.

When you go into Theatre, the dentist will complete some final checks, and it will then be time to have a rest. The anaesthetist may use a mask with 'smelly gasses'.

You will have a job to do with the Health Play Specialist. This provides you with a distraction whilst you nod off. Usually, it is a Where's Wally game or similar.

Whilst you are in theatre

Your parent/carer will wait outside recovery and when it is time for you to wake up, they will be called in to be with you. You will return to the ward, back to your allocated bedspace.

The dental nurse will provide you with a drink of water when you are feeing ready, and go through some aftercare before you are able to go home.
