Post operative instructions following intravenous sedation

- You must have a responsible adult at home with you for 24 hours following your procedure. You cannot be left alone and you must not look after dependent relatives (children or elderly adults etc).
- Do not drink alcohol for 24 hours after your procedure.
- You must not drive a car, ride a bike or operate any machinery including domestic appliances e.g. kettles, ovens etc.
- You should not make any important decisions, or sign any legal or business documents for 24 hours after your procedure.
- Do not lock yourself in any room alone, preventing emergency access to you.
- You must not return to work within 24 hours of your procedure.

Emergency contact

If you need any further advice, have any problems or feel unwell after your procedure including:

- Difficulty breathing or swallowing.
- Fever or high temperature.
- Excessive bleeding.
- Severe pain not relieved with pain killers.

Please do not hesitate to contact our department on 01744 646 730 between 9.00am and 5.00pm, Monday to Thursday and 9.00am to 4.00pm on Friday.
