Do I need an Injection?

Sometimes, a special liquid called contrast dye is given through a small injection. This helps make the pictures clearer. The radiographer will explain if you need this. The dye might make you feel warm or give you a funny taste in your mouth, this goes away quickly.

Aftercare - If you do have the special dye we recommend you have plenty to drink (water, squash, juice) to help the dye leave your body more quickly.

What is a CT scan?

A CT scan is a special type of X-ray that takes detailed pictures of the inside of your body. It helps doctors see things like your bones, organs and other body parts. The CT scanner looks like a big, round doughnut with a bed that slides through the middle.



Can my parent stay with me?

Yes, your parent or guardian can stay with you during the scan. They will need to wear a special apron.



Why do I need a CT scan?

Your doctor has asked for a CT scan, to help find out what is happening inside your body. It helps them check:

- Your head or brain.
- Your tummy or chest.
- Your bones.
- Other parts of your body.

The pictures help doctors understand what care or treatment you may need.

What happens during the scan?

Arriving at the hospital - You and your parent or guardian will come to the CT department. A radiographer will explain what will happen.

Changing clothes - You may need to change into a hospital gown and take off anything metal, like jewellery or hair clips.

The CT room - You will lie down on a bed. The bed moves slowly through the round scanner.

Staying still - It is very important to lie still so the pictures are clear. The scan only takes a few minutes.

The noises - The machine may make a quiet whirring or buzzing sounds. That is normal and nothing to worry about.



Top tips for the day

- Bring a favourite soft toy, blanket, or book.
- Wear comfy clothes.
- Ask lots of questions we love to answer them.
- Try to stay still like a statue.
