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It is important that you report any new or persistent problems to your GP, local A&E or Walk in Centre, since it is often impossible to recognise and treat all elements of injury or illness in a single visit. Meanwhile, follow the instructions below as indicated for you.

Most insect bites will not require hospital intervention and can be treated safely at home with over the counter medicines. They can be painful, irritating and sometimes blister, usually they are not serious. The department does not normally treat simple bites with any form of medication. There are some occasions when insect bites may become infected and subsequently leave people feeling unwell. Common symptoms of an infected bite include feeling feverish, shaking, nausea and tracking redness from the site of the bite.

If you are concerned that a bite has become infected or you feel unwell urgent medical attention should be sought.

Treatment

- Calamine lotion to soothe the skin. Antiseptics are not always necessary.
- Antihistamine tablets to relieve itching. Piriton is best for itching and redness, beware piriton can cause drowsiness so caution should be taken. The Pharmacist will be able to give advice on non-drowsy anti-histamines if people have an adverse reaction to piriton.
- It can be bought from any pharmacy without a prescription.
- Cover any blisters with a clean dressing.

No other treatment should be necessary. If in doubt, consult your own GP.
