Information For Patients With Microscopic Haematuria

Advice for patients with non visible blood in urine

During your visit to the emergency department it was found that you had a very small trace a blood in your urine only detectable by a special test.

This can be normal or due to a slight infection. You may have been given some antibiotics by the doctor who assessed you if they thought you had an infection.

Please arrange to have your urine re-tested at your GP's surgery in about 2 week's time. This is to make sure that the trace of blood has settled down.

If the trace of blood persists your GP may arrange some further tests.
