When to seek urgent help

Call the Gynaecology Assessment Unit (GAU) or go to GAU if you have:

- Heavy vaginal bleeding (soaking more than one pad per hour or passing large clots).
- Severe abdominal or pelvic pain that is worsening or not controlled with pain relief.
- Feeling faint, dizzy or collapsing.
- Fever, chills or signs of infection (feeling unwell, flu-like symptoms, foul-smelling discharge).
- Persistent vomiting or inability to keep fluids down in pregnancy.
- Any new or worrying symptoms.

If you are pregnant

Please be aware that:

- Pain or bleeding in early pregnancy can indicate an ectopic pregnancy, which can be life-threatening if untreated.
- If you develop severe pain, dizziness, or shoulder tip pain seek emergency help immediately. Dial 999.

If we have taken a blood sample during your visit that requires a repeat sample, please re-attend GAU on:
